



Analysis of the Available European Data

Only 20 out of 49 European NADOs published reports
Only 17 out of 49 reports with adequate data
Only 11 submitted their reports to WADA

- Number of tests (44,744)
- Number of violations (445 with 207 in BEL)

Five sports accounted for 49.7% of violations

| Sport | Violations | % of total |
|---------------|------------|------------|
| Bodybuilding | 121 | 27.2% |
| Cycling | 33 | 7.4% |
| Rugby | 25 | 5.6% |
| Weightlifting | 21 | 4.7% |
| Powerlifting | 21 | 4.7% |

Substances

Cannabis accounts for the largest number of violations

| Substance | Percentage |
|---------------------|------------|
| Cannabinoids | 18.7% |
| Anabolic Steroids | 18.0% |
| Refusals | 16.0% |
| Stimulants | 11.0% |
| Multiple Violations | 4.3% |

In-Competition vs. Out-of-Competition

9 NADOs reported 30,904 tests

| | Tests | Violations |
|--------------------|--------|------------|
| In-Competition | 13,738 | 222 |
| Out-of-Competition | 17,166 | 28 |

- 619 out-of-competition tests per violation
- 62 in-competition tests tests per violation

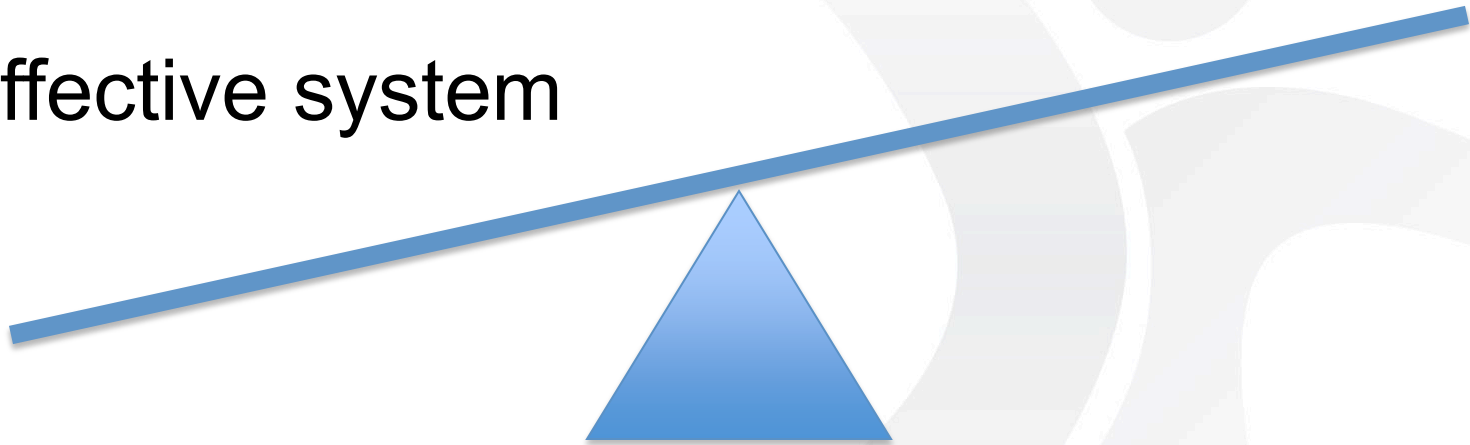
Report recommendations

- System is not effective

- CAS does not provide a fair trial
- Publicity is unfair
- Labs are questionable
- No accountability

Action

- Christmas Protest
- Research - “Adverse Analysis” and Athletes Commission study
- General complaint to the European Commission
- Join the “Canas” case before the ECJ
- EU Expert Group on Anti-doping
- Council of Europe
- Support Data Protection initiative in Germany
- Appeal to the EHCR - France

Germany

- Focus on Data Protection Law
- First request to the National and Regional Data Protection Authorities in February 2009
 - no content response until today
- Further requests with other Regional Data Protection Authorities
 - Very strong responses, underlining our concerns
- Christmas Protest
- Official opinion by Prof. Dr. Peter Wedde
- Data requests to NADA/WADA (according to the BDSG)

Reform

- Balance Infringements and Effectiveness
- Set system on solid legal basis
- Respect and protect fundamental rights of athletes
- Strengthen Participation of athletes
- Check on everybody, not just the athlete
- Proportionality
